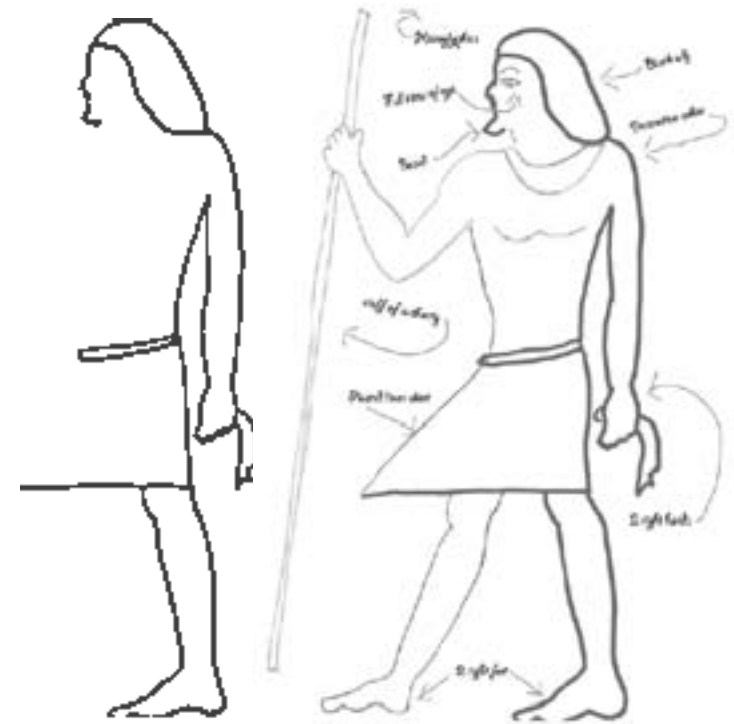

Follow this guide to find works of art from ancient times.

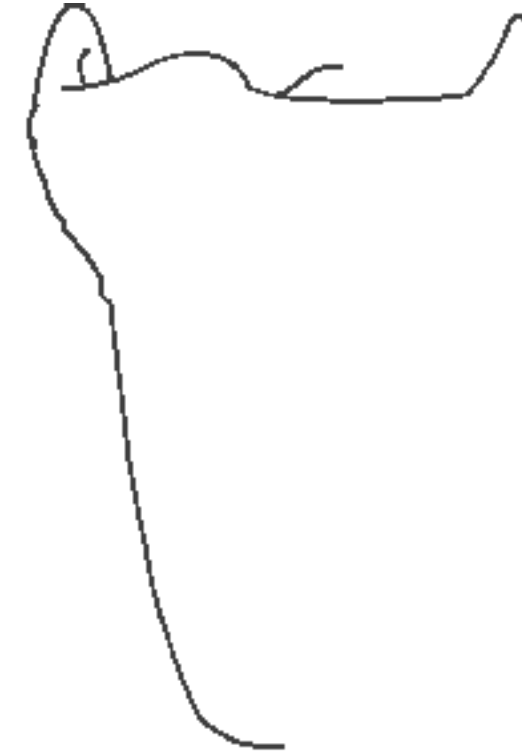
Analyze each work as an **archeologist**.

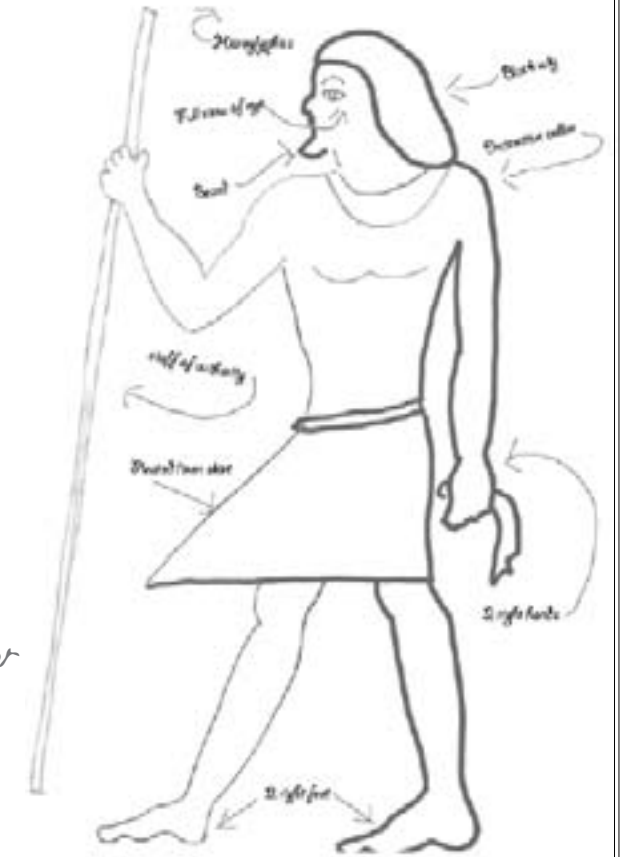

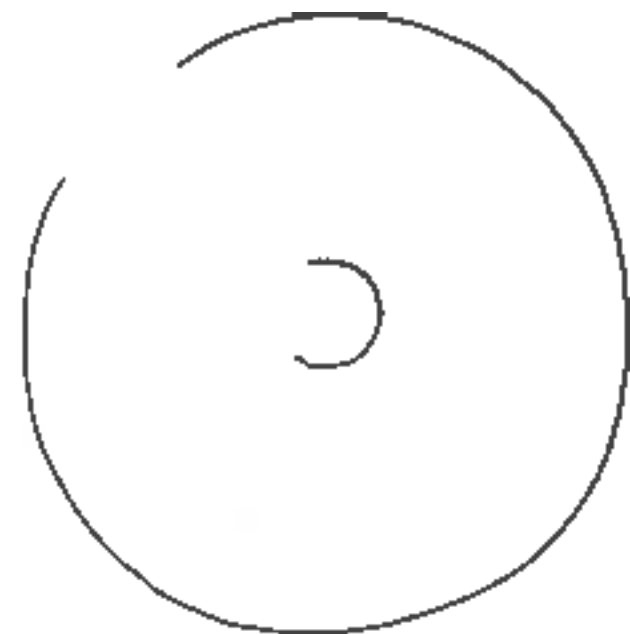
