HONOLULU, HAWAII— The Spalding House exhibition [Plastic Fantastic?](#) continues to inspire the museum to go green. That is why this month the museum asks visitors to help it make Bank of Hawaii Family Sunday: Plastic Fantastic? a plastic-free event. Families can make lei, wind chimes and buoys using recycled plastic and materials collected from O'ahu beaches by [Sustainable Coastlines Hawaii](#). Then they can share their commitment to make a positive impact on our environment and oceans by posting on social media with the hashtags: #PlasticFreeHawaii and #AAOPlastic. Families are encouraged to bring their reusable water bottles and fill them up for free at [Kokua Hawaii Foundation's](#) Plastic Free Hawai'i Water Station.

Bank of Hawaii brings to the museum their popular book swap featured at the Hawaii Book and Music Festival each year. Guests can bring a book (in good condition) to swap for another book. Books of all family-friendly genres are accepted.

O'ahu-based folk/rock/bluegrass group [Butterside Down](#) kicks off the entertainment on the Central Courtyard stage. Then the [Honolulu Theatre for Youth](#) performs a short version of their production H2O: The Story of Water and Hawaii. Then families can unwind for an acoustic blues/rock/reggae session with [Paul Izak](#).

This month's Family Film Sunday selection is [Waltah the Worm: Ka Wai Ola](#). Families can join Kimo and Waltah on their staycation, as they check into the Sheraton Waikiki Hotel and take the "Ka Wai Ola" tour with the Board of Water Supply to learn about the

importance of Hawai'i's fresh water. During this "ed-venture" they take a trip with Arthur Aiu to the beautiful Hāmama Falls, check out the dark Waihe'e Tunnel, learn about the purple pipes at the Honouliuli Wastewater Treatment Facility, and tour the Board of Water Supply's Hālawa Xeriscape Garden with Diane Moses.

At Doris Duke Theatre, children age 17 and under always receive free admission to all films and concerts (except on festival opening nights).

The museum invites visitors to enter the popular monthly drawing contest, for children ages 1 to 17. The museum gives contestants a theme and drawing supplies. The winner receives a Supporting-level membership to the Honolulu Museum of Art (\$100 value), and his or her artwork is used to create the following month's event brochure and is posted on the museum website. FAMILY DAY AT SPALDING HOUSE

Take a free shuttle up to Spalding House where the fun continues. This month's event is inspired by the exhibition *Plastic Fantastic?* Families can explore the exhibition to see the different ways that artists use plastic in their work and draw attention to the issues surrounding the use of plastic. Families can then participate in Plastic Free Hawai'i games on the Spalding House Lawn, and watch artist Shannon McCarthy use found beach debris and plastic to create a mural.
