Must have access to independent transportation in order to travel around Oahu.

- Bachelor's degree or higher in Studio Arts or Art Education.
- Teaching experience.
- Excellent verbal and interpersonal skills, including the ability to speak to large groups.
- Ability to work effectively with staff, volunteers, children, teachers, and members of the public.
- Highly organized, tactful, and flexible.
- Has access to independent transportation in order to travel around Oahu.
- Understanding of Honolulu Museum of Art's established identity and dedication to advancing it.
- Intelligent self-starter who is committed to the museum's mission.
