SUPPLY LIST

PLEASE NOTE: There is a \$15 materials fee payable to the instructor that covers specific calligraphy supplies, including nibs, pens and practice paper. In addition, the student is responsible for the following supplies:

Items 1, 2 & 8 should be brought to the first class. All the rest can wait, if necessary, and will be discussed during the first class meeting.

- 1. Pencils (2B, 2H and a couple of others), a good eraser and a sharpener
- 2. Favorite writing tools (ball point pens, gel pens, roller ball pens, etc.)
- 3. 1 or 2 small watercolor paint brushes (old paintbox brushes work well), nothing fancy
- 4. Watercolor paints of your choice (nothing fancy, the the small tubes are best)
- 5. Any plastic or porcelain palette or plate for mixing watercolors
- 6. Water container (large yogurt containers work well)
- 7. A sheet of Arches 90# (OK) or 140# (better) Hot Press watercolor paper ($22^{\circ} \times 30^{\circ}$) (Having hot press paper is important it's the kind with the smooth surface, not bumpy)
- 8. Spiral bound sketch pad (at least $11^{\circ} \times 14^{\circ}$) or other paper on which to draw, sketch and otherwise take notes and doodle (this is not technically required, but will be very helpful to have).
- 9. Paper towels (good ones, like Bounty are best), or a soft cotton rag
- 10. Some big bag to carry all your stuff
