All of these colors are bright; if possible, please buy all from one manufacturer (column). If not, choose one color from each highlighted row (for example either Bumble Bee, Primary, or Hansa Yellow Light) and one from those marked ** (eg. Joe's Red, Sandal Red, or Permanenet Red; and either Joe's Green, Green Blue, or Phthalo Turquoise).

Recommended Paper: Arches 140 lb cold press is a good, all-around paper. Start with this and play with others later. Hot Press paper is smooth like card stock and takes the paint differently. Do NOT buy student-grade paper (Strathmore, Canson), it is not worth the aggravation!

Recommended Palette: Jones Color Round, Stephan Quiller, or any covered palette. A round palette is helpful when you are first learning the color wheel.

Recommended Brushes: Rounds sized 8 and larger; Flats sized 1/2" and larger. Cheap Joes Legend Kolinsky Sables are quite good and go on sale regularly. Other Cheap Joe's brushes I recommend include their 50/50 brushes, all sizes including the cat's tongue.

Backing Board: Coroplast or any other kind of board that can withstand a lot of water. A 24"x36" sized sheet is easily cut to smaller sizes. You will want two backing boards 1-2" larger than your paper.

Paper Towels (paper towels without an embossed pattern, eg. Viva, are best), a **Spray Mister Bottle**, **Crepe Paper** (Floradec or Ben Franklin), **Jute** (City Mill), and a **sketchbook**.
